

East, Marshall Booters Tie, Named Section 5 Co-Champs

Ben Daly's East High and Tony Gerace's Marshall soccer teams were named co-champs of the Class A division after battling to a scoreless tie in the Section 5 Soccer Tournament final at Charlotte yesterday afternoon.

The championship was divided after tournament officials went to the rule-book when the tie still wasn't broken after two overtimes and found a rule which stated that "in Section 5 finals, play cannot continue past two overtime periods."

In other games yesterday, defending champion Pittsford lost the Class B crown to Marion in a 3-1 defeat; Penfield won the Class C title by defeating Naples 1-0; and Canaseraga copped the Class D laurels with a 4-1 victory over Scio at Andover. The Class B and Class C games were also played at Charlotte.

Marshall dominated play in the first half of the Class A battle, but the Orientals were pounding at the Statesmen's goal throughout the second half and the two overtime periods.

Louis Spiotti, who subbed for ailing Daly yesterday, singled out goalie Tony Rinaldi and co-captain Buzz Boomer as stand-outs for East High.

A first period goal by Joe Scrooby gave Marion a lead it held throughout over Pittsford. Paul Russell and Bill Yantz scored fourth period penalty kicks for Marion and Pittsford,
